The curriculum as such covers humanities and other Soft skill courses along with the usual Engineering Professional Ethics, Design Engineering to Sustainable Engineering and Life Skills to Professional Cor all these courses for the holistic development of students.

The process of accumulating "activity points" as a mandatory part of the curricula ensures the student the benefit of the society. The value based courses hosted by several agencies are identified as sources that open up their arena and grow in a multidimensional way.

Multidisciplinary research and projects have been initiated in several areas with faculty from many Departments expected to be successful in producing papers and patents.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

TKM College of Engineering was granted autonomous status by UGC in 2022. Soon after being conferred as an Academic Depository (NAD) and the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC). As an initial step of being onboarded, the students from 2022 admissions onwards.

With wide publicity and constant follow-up among the students, the College has created their ABC IDs. The process of uploading the grade cards of these students, with their ABC IDs, is being carried out. Around 60% of the students who joined in 2023 have already created the ABC IDs and constant follow-up is being carried out for their ABC IDs so that the grade cards of the students can be made available in the NAD portal as soon as possible. The target of 100% registration of all students admitted since 2022 in ABC will be achieved soon and the students will be ready so that the students can avail the benefits of multiple entries and exits. The benefits of the ABC system for the students. The College has made it mandatory for all the students who joined the College after it attained autonomous status at multiple levels is being carried out to ensure that the students create the ABC IDs as soon as they are admitted. TKM College of Engineering has implemented several initiatives to enhance vocational education and skill development. The courses under the Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF). One significant effort is the integration of skill development courses cover a wide range of skills relevant to the industry, ensuring that students are equipped with the necessary skills in their chosen fields. The laboratory components of the courses directly contribute to the development of skills.

Additionally, the college organizes Skill Development programs through workshops, seminars, and training students under AICTE-Idea Lab. Workshop on 3d Modelling and Printing, Skilling Workshop on Embedded Systems, and sessions with industry experts to further enhance students employability skills. Further, sessions on communication skills provide students with real-world experiences and prepare them for the demands of the professional world.

Furthermore, the college emphasizes experiential learning through internships, industry visits, and hands-on projects to gain knowledge in practical settings and develop industry-specific skills.

ASAP (additional Skill Acquisition Programme) by Government of Kerala has established an ASAP Training Programme for implementation.

Through these initiatives, TKM College of Engineering ensures that students receive a well-rounded education that encompasses the rich cultural heritage of India.
